

About the seminar:

Exemplars are samples of student work which are used to illustrate dimensions of quality. They are a potentially useful element of assessment for learning in higher education because they can support learner understanding of the nature of goals and standards. This presentation reports on the early stages of a project which seeks to enhance the use of exemplars amongst participating teachers in a Faculty of Education. A key emerging issue is that it is the quality of the dialogue around exemplars which is crucial in optimizing student learning. Some suggestions for good practice in the dialogic use of exemplars are discussed. The focus on exemplars and dialogue opens up research on the interaction of explicit, latent and meta-criteria occurring in the dialogue and the operation of trade-offs in judgments of quality.
